Mural Dedicated

Orville Morey of Kewanee got a surprise recently when a mural in his honor was unveiled on the outside of the henry County Historical Museum in Bishop Hill. "I can't get over this. It made tears run," he responded after Roger Anderson, HCHS Board Member and Past President, asked him if he recognized the guy with the suspenders and thanked Morey for all he'd done for the museum.

The 10 ft. by 7 ft. mural was painted by Lauren Schroeder, daughter of Dee Schroeder of Moline, and granddaughter of Marilyn and Wilbur Nelson of rural Cambridge. Lauren met Orville last fall and took photographs of his 1913 Case 50 horsepower traction steam engine.

She spent this past winter in her grandfather's Butler Building painting the mural featuring Morey and his 101 year old steam engine. She had to use the internet to look up dimensions and some details such as handles and chains to make the steam engine just right. Morey did not know that his picture was going to be on the mural.

Morey said when he found the rusty steam engine in 1965 it had been sitting in a timber near Osceola for 20 years. McNeil's Asphalt brought it to his home in Kewanee on a big long trailer. His wife, Nancy, said "It really got attention coming down Main Street!" Morey decided to do something on the machine every day, even if it was to just tighten a bolt. He stuck to that project plan, and in two years, it was ready to display.

He displayed the steam engine and did threshing demonstrations in the fall for many years until his health and costs forced him to stop. "We can't have the steam engine here in Bishop Hill anymore, so we have this mural instead," remarked Morey. "It sure don't look more than 100 years old," he grinned.






Galva Mining

Coal mines were numerous near Galva during the years that Olof Krans lived there. In addition to commercial signs for the mining companies, Krans did this scene a short distance east of town near the Rock Island railroad tracks. It is thought to be the Galva Coal Co.



Olof signed OKrans below the fence at the right, and while there is no date, it is believed to have been one of his earliest such works, probably in the 1870's.
